Access Programme

The National College of Art & Design's Access Programme commenced in 2004. This programme aims to nurture and sustain links, initially with ten primary and eight secondary schools, in the Dublin 8 and Dublin 12 community and to schools nationally.

The NCAD Access Programme is a college wide initiative and has planned a number of interventions into the teaching programmes in local primary and post-primary schools. The objective will be to stimulate constructive and challenging engagement with the visual arts and develop interest and awareness of art and design as options for life.



The NCAD Access Programme is multi-faceted and inter-disciplinary and offers a number of options including:

Access Days – schools are invited to bring selected class groups into college for hands-on engagement with art and design studio work.

Art & Design Projects – In 2005/06 NCAD collaborated with An Post for the Europa Design a Stamp Project. Students from NCAD worked with designated Access Schools on submitting entries. Three submissions have since been commissioned for stamp designs.

Shadowing Programme – Secondary schools will be invited to select students who demonstrate creative potential to shadow art students as part of a College Taster Project.
