#### Introduction

The aims of this module are:

1. Identify a theme for a final project and undertake research for a project.
2. Present and display final project material.
3. Encourage students to work independently on a self-directed photography project.

#### What will I learn?

On successful completion of this module students will be able to:

- Describe the research processes undertaken to translate ideas into practice.
- Select appropriate research methodologies to support a photography project.
- Present ideas informing studio work to their peers and describe how their work relates to contemporary practice.
- Consolidate skills and knowledge acquired in previous modules and apply to final project.
- Present a coherent body of work for display.
- Evaluate their progress and show increased independence toward the development of a professional practice.
