Monday 9th June

"Fashion is one of the greatest vehicles to merge music, art, architecture, design, typography — it's a wide enough canvas, or a big enough sandbox, to touch all the different things that I'm into." — Virgil Abloh.

Tutor: Aisling McLoughlin

This is a 2D to 3D immersive workshop that will introduce participants to the creative process that a Fashion Designer undertakes to come up with innovative and unique concepts for clothing for all genders. Participants will discover insights as to how a Fashion Designer actually thinks and works and also considers new ways of working towards a more sustainable future. You will begin by gathering visual research, rapid observational drawing exercise from everyday life architecture and objects as potential. You will then extract from this to make paper constructions / sculptures on mannequins that can further be developed into soft material. Throughout the process you will explore different shapes, structures, forms and construction methods along with some material manipulation techniques that could further be explored / developed for the torso. Participants will identify how by following this process they can produce new and exciting creative outcomes for a thoroughly immersive collection of clothing.

Monday 9th June

You will be taken on a 20 minute visit to the surrounding area of the National College of Art and Design, where you can find material to further develop back at the Studio. You will use your phone camera and sketch to record images. Once back at the studio.your chosen subject will then be edited and transferred to prepared paper to be further developed in Acrylic paint. During this workshop you will see the potential of the locality through photography and will also have a short introduction to Colour Theory and Colour Mixing in Acrylic Paint

NCAD Workshops

Monday 10th June

Join artist Janine Davidson for these exciting printmaking workshops inspired by the architecture and historical features of the NCAD campus and its environs. We will spend time observing and sketching to inspire our own original Fine Art Prints. Using sketches and digital photography as source material we will explore a variety of printmaking techniques. We will be using recycled materials to create collagraphs of local characteristics and landmarks. A collagraph is essentially a collage of materials of various textures glued on to a printing plate, often a thin wood or cardboard.

Monday 10th June

In this workshop, participants will explore how to utilize camera and lighting tools. We will discuss how to craft an immersive tone within our work, providing participants with the fundamentals of creating ambiance, tone, and flair in their moving-image projects. The Creative Industries and Visual Culture (CIViC) programme at TU Dublin invites you to join us for a 2-hour workshop. Working in groups, you will write, design and perform your own MANIFESTO, a socially-informed intervention in the everyday. From autographed urinals and spoons worn in the lapel to giant puppets and guerrilla gardening, the "disobedient object" has enabled the linking of art and politics. As long ago as Marcel Duchamp's 'Ready Mades', artists, designers and activists have been using objects, images and manifesti to upset the status quo, challenge injustice and campaign for social change.

After a brief introduction, you will work in groups to decide on a joint manifesto. This may be 'about' anything but must encourage change in attitudes or behaviour. You will then be asked to produce the manifesto, using a collage of words and images, in a poster format (materials will be provided). We will print a limited edition of each poster for you to take away. Finally, in order to share with all participants and bystanders, each group will perform a live "happening" of your manifesto.

Thursday 12th June

Drama is very social, fun and is the only art form that you just need people to create. Using games, playing and improvising, participants will be invited to create characters and mini-plays on subjects that are important to them. Participants will then look at the other artistic craft elements one can add to drama to make it theatre, such as sound, costume, set and audience placement. The workshop will also involve a visit to our blackbox theatre and the set of the current production.

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RCSI Workshops Tuesday 17th June

Drawing from the human figure is the cornerstone of many artists' work and overlaps with the surface anatomy teaching students undertake at RCSI. Life drawing is a fantastic way to increase your observational skills and sketching abilities using simple implements.

In this workshop you will draw from life models using Conté crayons on paper, building a series of sketches throughout the session. We will look at how light and shade, and the 'negative space' around the model can be used to help us describe and record what we see.

Tuesday 17th June

Inspired by the world of special effects and informed by science - the RCSI SIMULATION (SIM) Team crafts and creates immersive learning experiences. This workshop will explore the tools, techniques, and technologies we use to simulate real-world illnesses, scenarios and surgeries. Learn how the RCSI SIM build eyes from scratch, create convincing costumes and make fake bodies feel real using everything from makeup to meat. You will build an eye from scratch with the SIM TEAM and learn about a medical procedure used to take pressure off the eye in a simulated environment.

That's what Bob Dylan wrote in his song 'Tangled Up in Blue'. But you don't have to win the Nobel Prize Winner for Literature to write red hot words. You just need to write a poem, rap, song or story that rings true - even if you made the whole thing up. How do you make your writing ring true? It helps if you start with real feelings and real experiences. This workshop will explore how to 'write up a glow' in a relaxed and enjoyable way. Using prompts that come from familiar things and stories, we will riff together on what it means to make it real. Catherine Ann Cullen was Poetry Ireland's inaugural Poet in Residence from 2019 to 2022. She is an award-winning poet, children's writer, songwriter and community artist. She has twice won the Business to Arts Award for Best Use of Creativity in the Community. Her eighth book, Storm Damage, will be published by Dedalus in October 2025.


