# 1. Introduction

This module is offered to all incoming year one students excluding BA Education and Design or Fine Art students and BA Visual Culture students, and provides an opportunity to:

- Learn how to locate, navigate and utilise key information and learning resources within NCAD;
- Develop a range of study, workshop, and digital skills to assist in their academic development and emerging professional identity as artists/designers/educators.

This module addresses the development of students' identity within higher education and wider afield as well as the acquisition of generic study skills applicable to research and practice. Students will be encouraged to foster attitudinal approaches appropriate to their formation as learners and practitioners.

This module will provide an introduction to art, design, and creative practice as a mode of enquiry starting from the concrete needs of the student as a learner. It will provide students with an understanding of key concepts, develop their capacity for independent enquiry and their management of learning and assessment. As part of the process of developing a learner identity, students will use active research to develop effective use of the college learning resources for

research and practice. Students will avail of the Library and workshops in the development of academic writing skills and practice techniques. Learn to use the online learning resources of the College. Begin to develop relevant digital skills with appropriate methodologies, for both their use as students and for their practice in art and design disciplines.

# 2. What will I learn?

On successful completion of this module students will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate an evolving and effective use of a range of the learning resources and information sources within the college environment;
- 2. Show evidence of emerging capacity to use digital tools and software effectively as students of art and design.

## **Module content**

#### Inductions

Libraries - In this module students will be introduced to the two Libraries in NCAD, Nival and The Edward Murphy library, students will be introduced to the Library collections and how to search and use these libraries.

LinkedIn Learning - Students will be introduced to LinkedIn Learning online learning resource available through NCAD and taught how to use this resource.

Workshops - Students will have inductions to the three technical workshops in the first year department, here they will learn about the processes available to them in the workshops and safe working methods and workshop practices.

#### **Digital Skills**

Digital learning -There will be a series of online workshops on digital processes where students will learn digital skills relevant to their practices in art and design.

## Lectures

The module will include lectures on the following:

Assessment, outlining the different aspects and methods of assessment that they will encounter in their third level programme.

Research methods and Academic writing, this lecture will give students a guide to useful approaches, practices and methods for academic research and writing for third level.

### **Department overviews**

There will be introductory talks to the Art and Design Schools by the Heads of School and Heads of Departments in the college, this will support the students in developing an overview of the disciplines taught in NCAD and will assist Common Entry and Fine Art students in refining their choice of specialism for their degree path.

## Seminars, Panel discussions and tours

Additional lectures and seminars that situate contemporary art and design practices and their concerns are occasionally integrated into this module. These aim to give the beginning student



insight into the fields as they are happening. Where possible tours and virtual tours /engagements will also be integrated into the module to give insight into the day to day practices of artists and designers.

The aim of these supplemental elements further supports the student to orient themselves within the fields of art and design to form contemporary understandings of these practices and ultimately helps the student to make informed choices about their specialist path.

# 3. How will I learn?

This module will be delivered through a series of inductions both online and face to face that are coupled with set briefs and tasks that enable the student to test and put this learning into practice.

Digital learning will be delivered via a series of online practical workshops students will be set weekly activities that they will then upload. Learning will be both individual and through peer learning

Assessment of this module includes multiple inputs.

Assessment 1 library quiz feedback will be given 2 weeks after submission, a resubmission opportunity will be given if there is a failure or a non-submission.

Linked in learning is assessed immediately this assignment is given before the induction lecture and feedback is part of the lecture.

Workshop inductions are mandatory as part of health and safety regulations no student is permitted to use the workshop unless they have attended their inductions. Assessment is pass, fail

Digital learning tasks will be weekly, each task will be a pass, fail, based on having achieved the technical task correctly. Feedback will be ongoing during workshop sessions in shared viewing of work produced.

Attendance at lectures is considered as engagement in the module and counts towards the assessment of studentship.

The cumulative success in the above submissions combine for the student to gain 5 credits in this grade neutral module. Each of the tasks and deliverables in this module are easily achieved in themselves, cumulatively they are essential to the success of the student in the overall programme as a whole as the skills underpin learning processes needed across all areas of the course. On-going



commitment to the work of the module is therefore essential to general success for the student. Workshop inductions are mandatory.
