- Enable students to begin to position their interests within the field of art and design.
- Introduce a range of creative methodologies and strategies that frame professional presentation, exhibition and documentation of work.

What will I learn?

- Demonstrate a recognition of the creative context for design and fine art.
- Demonstrate the ability to reflect on personal strengths and weaknesses within the context of the field of design and fine art.
- Communicate proposals and concepts using a range of methods and sources drawn from the Design or Fine Art professional field.
