1. Introduction

This module focuses on the development of skills and knowledge used to examine and analyse visual material from art history to modern and post-modern period.

The aims of this module are to:

1. Develop a knowledge of visual culture and critical cultures.
2. Understand key phases and themes in art and design history.
3. Outline new and contemporary approaches to art and design making.
4. Recognise the impact of technology on art and design.
5. Contribute to class based discussions and arguments in relation to developments in critical cultures.
6. Encourage field trips to museums and galleries.

2. What will I learn?

On successful completion of this module students will be able to:

- Examine key developments in visual art and design history of the 20th century and contemporary period,
- Distinguish between art history, visual culture, and critical culture
- Describe key theories and ideas that inform art, design and visual culture,
- Critically analyse and assess visual imagery in terms of the cultural, social context from which they emerged,
