#### Introduction

This module focuses on the development of skills and knowledge applicable to the formation of a studio practice. The course focuses on expanding technical skills and knowledge of drawing and painting processes.

The aims of this module are to:

1. Encourage students to examine traditional and contemporary approaches to studio practice,
2. Become familiar with a range of materials and techniques used in painting,
3. Demonstrate a knowledge of classical and contemporary art practice,
4. Acquire skills and techniques in drawing and painting,
5. Develop skills in observation and drawing the figure.

#### What will I learn?

On successful completion of this module students will be able to:

1. Compile of range of visual imagery and resources for research,
2. Demonstrate observation and drawing skills and apply to practice,
3. Engage with and resolve formal painting problems,
4. Experiment with a materials and techniques,
5. Apply a variety of water and oil based paint media, primers, supports,
6. Present a body of work for display.
