1. Introduction

This module focuses on the development of skills and knowledge applicable to the formation of a professional practice and identity as a visual art practitioner.

The aims of this module are to:

- Raise awareness of the design process from research stages through to finished work.
- Explore traditional and contemporary approaches to design.
- Explore colour theory and apply to design processes.
- Apply techniques of textile print creatively.
- Experiment with a range of materials and designs.

2. What will I learn?

On successful completion of this module students will be able to:

1. Establish a research process suitable to printing and design.
2. Demonstrate the use of dyes and pigments within the printing process.
3. Translate ideas and research materials into designs suitable for fashion or interior markets.
4. Select appropriate materials for project work.
5. Observe appropriate health and safety regulations for studio practice.
6. Present a body of work for display.
