1. Introduction

The aims of this module are:

- Encourage students to generate ideas for projects.
- Develop students' confidence to develop ideas and select appropriate research methodologies for practice.
- Establish ways of working applicable to professional practice.
- Equip students with knowledge and skills to sustain a research project.

2. What will I learn?

On successful completion of this module students will be able to:

1. Demonstrate an approach to research that is exploratory and robust.
2. Select appropriate research methodologies and apply to practice.
3. Evaluate the range and depth of ideas informing the final project.
4. Demonstrate a reflective approach to an emerging practice.
5. Present a coherent body of work for display.
