#### 1. Introduction

The aim of this module is to introduce students to a design idea process and contribute to the development of a collection of finished pieces through research, investigation and problem-solving.

#### 2. What will I learn?

On successful completion of this module students will be able to:

- 1. Present their research process;
- 2. Collate, describe and investigate in response to a project brief;
- 3. Enhance their practical skills and apply them to design processes;
- 4. Demonstrate appropriate practices and engagement for studio.

#### **Module content**

This module is project led, with a studio-based brief to explore and respond to, requiring students to use a range of sources and methods of investigation to address the brief.

## 3. How will I learn?

Students will engage in studio-based projects, learning practical skills through project work. A tutor-led critical review will be scheduled at key points in the trimester. Approaches to learning include inquiry and problem-based learning. Seminars and lectures also feature. Students will be supported to work independently over the duration of the module.
