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#### Introduction

This module focuses on the development of skills and knowledge applicable to a self-directed research project the outcomes of which will form part of the final display.

The aims of this module are:

1. Select a theme or idea for in depth exploration in a project,
2. Advance students research skills and individuals' ability to direct a research project,
3. Demonstrate an awareness of contemporary practice and the locate their practice within contemporary field,
4. Document the research process from initial stages to resolution,
5. Enhance students ability to critically appraise their work and support editing of a body of work,
6. Plan and complete a research project.

#### What will I learn?

On successful completion of this module students will be able to:

- Devise a research proposal for a self-directed project,
- Apply appropriate research methodologies for research and practice,
- Examine ideas for expansion within a research process,
- Experiment with materials and processes to expand discipline boundaries,
- Demonstrate through notebooks the research process over the duration of the project,
- Edit and Present a coherent body of work for display.

#### How will I learn?

- Tutorial, group presentation, display, group crit, seminars
- Workshops in studio and on location

- The one-to-one tutorials will assist students to develop their practice.
- Self-directed work outside class.
- Studio practice – students work in the studio amongst their peers and tutors.
- Peer based group discussion, led by the student group, documented and a source for reflective learning captured in notebooks
