1. Introduction

This module concentrates on developing and consolidating students' professional identity and formation as artists.

The aims of this module are:

- 1. Increase a knowledge and awareness of ideas informing contemporary curatorial practices.
- 2. Examine factors influencing display of artwork in public and private spaces.
- 3. Map contemporary gallery and exhibition spaces, public and private.
- 4. Demonstrate the application of practical skills in the selection and presentation of work.
- 5. Critically assess the presentation of art work for display.

2. What will I learn?

On successful completion of this module students will be able to:

- 1. Identify a range of gallery / cultural spaces in Dublin and its environs.
- 2. Critically assess a social-cultural space for display of contemporary artwork.
- 3. Recognise the complexity of the art world and the issues of display.
- 4. Collaborate with their peers in the development of exhibition ideas and approaches to display of artwork.
- 5. Plan a small group exhibition and produce a press release for promotional purposes.
- 6. Produce a statement that articulates their final project work.
- 7. Locate their emerging practice within the contemporary art world.
