Introduction

The module offers students an opportunity to devise and progress a studio based project utilising practice based research methods relevant to the discipline area. Students will be required to demonstrate a detailed research process through participation in seminars, discussion groups and formative presentations of evolving project work.

The aims of this module are:

1. Develop and sustain a research project,
2. Undertake self-directed research for studio project,
3. Progress themes and ideas relevant to studio project,
4. Show an understanding of an emerging identity as an artist.

What will I learn?

On successful completion of this module students will be able to:

- Present and defend their project work to their peers,
- Demonstrate an ethical approach to research and studio practice,
- Apply appropriate techniques to resolve conceptual problems or challenges,
- Plan projects and effectively manage time,
- Interpret the boundaries of their discipline in the context of contemporary expanded practices or painting,
- Argue the position and meaning of their emerging practice within contemporary discourses.

How will I learn?

Students will participate in tutorials, seminars and lectures. Adult students tend to be active participants and therefore tutors will respond to student queries, through individual and group based tutorials. Students will participate with seminars with visiting lectures, undertake visits to

galleries and engage in dialogue and debate in response to briefs and projects set by tutors. Specified learning activities involve student led discussions and seminars presenting student progress on their research. Student will be required to document the process and include reflective peer learning as part of the portfolio of module work.

Students will receive a written brief and assessment guidelines from the module tutor at the outset of the module.

Students will be assessed formatively and at the end of the trimester. A feature of formative assessment will be a series of group crits where students are required to participate, summarise their progress and make presentations to their peers.

Students can expect written and verbal feedback on assessment outcomes.

How will I have the chance to evaluate the module?
