1. Introduction

The aim of this module is to provide the student with the opportunity to apply the subject specific design skills, knowledge and understanding, as well as personal transferable skills, acquired in the programme, to address a range of real world projects and undertake research projects within a design bureau for an additional half trimester. Enhancing their skillsets by exploring unfamiliar contexts.

The module seeks to:

1. Enable students to build upon the Design Bureau Major module and gain further real life 'practical' experience within a series of multi-disciplinary design teams.
2. Increase student employability and transversal skillsets.
3. Enhance team working skills by exploring a range of unfamiliar contexts.
4. Provide students with a number of inter-disciplinary peer networks.
5. Develop critical thinking ahead of students' final year in college and their early post-college career.

Under the direction of NCAD staff and industry practitioners, students identify opportunities, generate ideas, and make tools for positive industry and/or social change.

The module forms part of the Studio+ suite of modules, which seek to give Design students at NCAD a sense of independence and professionalism as they work collaboratively with each other, and with external organisations.

The module is underpinned by lectures, seminars and workshops delivered through three pillars:

Real World Projects: Live, commercial, social and cultural projects within departmental and/or disciplinary teams.

Professional Scaffolding: a blend of school wide and department specific skills training to help equip students with the professional and digital skills required by Industry.

Thematics: a selection of interdisciplinary design projects addressing the big challenges of today to provide a thinking space for research.

2. What will I learn?

On successful completion of projects within the design bureau, students will be able to:

1. Demonstrate an ability to work with clients to research, develop and deliver design for industry and social design projects.
2. Demonstrate advanced project planning, critical research and organisational skills in a range of contexts.
3. Apply design skills, knowledge and understanding acquired in the programme, to a series of real world situations across a range of contexts.
4. Demonstrate advanced professional, interpersonal and communication skills appropriate to a series of team based workplace situations.

3. How will I learn?

Students will learn through a combination of set activities within the studio and self-directed study within and outside the studio.

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9. How will I have the chance to evaluate the module?
