1. Introduction

The aim of this module is to provide the student with the opportunity to apply the subject specific design skills, knowledge and understanding, as well as personal transferable skills, acquired in the programme, to address real world projects and undertake research projects within a design bureau for a trimester.

The module seeks to:

1. Enable students to gain real life ‘practical’ experience within a multi-disciplinary design team.
2. Increase student employability.
3. Develop team working skills.
4. Provide students with an inter-disciplinary peer network.
5. Develop critical thinking ahead of students’ final year in college and their early post-college career.

Under the direction of NCAD staff and industry practitioners, students identify opportunities, generate ideas, and make tools for positive industry and sectoral change.

The module forms part of the Studio+ suite of modules, which seek to give Design students at NCAD a sense of independence and professionalism as they work collaboratively with each other, and with external organisations.

The module is underpinned by lectures, seminars and workshops delivered through:

Real World Projects: Live, commercial and cultural projects within departmental and/or disciplinary teams.

Professional Scaffolding: a blend of school wide and department specific skills training to help equip students with the professional and digital skills required by Industry.

2. What will I learn?

On successful completion of the module, students will be able to:

1. DELIVER: Demonstrate an understanding of how to work with clients to research, develop and deliver design for industry and sectoral projects.
2. PLAN: Demonstrate project planning, critical research and organisational skills.
3. APPLY: Apply design skills, knowledge and understanding acquired in the programme, to a real-world situation.
4. COLLABORATE: Demonstrate professional, interpersonal and communication skills appropriate to a team-based workplace situation.

3. How will I learn?

Students will learn through a combination of set activities within the studio and self-directed study within and outside the studio.

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9. How will I have the chance to evaluate the module?
