## Synopsis

This course explores modern and contemporary design and will draw on key theoretical frameworks from design studies, the history of technology and New Media Theory. Key themes within the study of modern and contemporary design will be interrogated, together with its intersection with cultures of technology. In doing so, the design, development, use and understanding of technological artefacts will be considered.

This module is available as an elective option for postgraduate students in Fine Art, Education or Design.

## What will I learn?

RESEARCH: i) Gain a thorough and advanced understanding of the themes and methods used in the study of design, technology and society in modern and contemporary contexts ii) develop competencies in the treatment of primary and secondary sources pertaining to the relationship between design, technology and society.
- 2. ANALYSE: i) Develop advanced critical literacy in the interpretation of modern and contemporary design ii) Develop experience and competency in the application of interdisciplinary analytic constructs to the study of design, technology and society in historical and contemporary contexts.
- 3. COMMUNICATE: Develop the skills to write an essay which demonstrates an advanced understanding of the themes, theoretical paradigms and concepts covered in the course.
