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Introduction

This module is offered to incoming year one BA Joint Hons Education Design or Fine Art students and provides an opportunity to:

- Learn how to locate, navigate and utilise key information and learning resources within NCAD and in external settings.
- Develop a range of study skills to assist in their academic development and emerging professional identity as artists/designers/educators.
- Develop an understanding of the field of sociology as it relates to education and schooling.

Research and study skills

This unit addresses the development of students' identity within art and design and education and further afield and it facilitates the development of the generic study skills applicable to research and practice. Students will be encouraged to foster attitudinal approaches appropriate to their formation as learners and practitioners.

It will provide students with an understanding of key concepts, develop their capacity for independent enquiry and their management of learning and assessment. Students will use active research methods to explore the subject of Sociology and how it relates to Education. They will effectively use the college learning resources for research and practice. Students wil avail of the Library and workshops in the the development of academic writing skills and practice techniques.

What will I learn?

On successful completion of students will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate an evolving and effective use of a range of the learning resources and information sources both within and outside of the college environment.
- 2. Show evidence of an emerging capacity to research and communicate effectively as students of art and design education.

- 3. Students will recognise the characteristics of art education in an educational setting and engage appropriately in that area.
- 4. Students will become familiar with recurring themes in education and society.
- 5. Students will examine what it means to be a 'teacher' in the context of a 'teacher-pupil relationship' (e.g. respect for persons/for individuality etc).
