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Introduction

This module aims to increase student's understanding of their pedagogical practices in the contexts of art and design education at second level. Students will explore subject matter (content) knowledge, general knowledge of instructional methods (pedagogical knowledge), and pedagogical content knowledge (knowledge that is unique to teachers and is based on the manner in which teachers relate their pedagogical knowledge (what they know about teaching) to their subject matter knowledge (what they know about what they teach)) (Cochran, 1997).

This module aims to facilitate students in orientating their learning towards educational purposes and practices. There are two main elements contained within the module:

- an engagement with the processes of learning inherent to art and design (Curriculum, Pedagogical Studies and Professional Preparation for the Classroom, and
- an engagement with the practices and structures of education, including schooling at primary and post-primary levels.

The module involves a set of lectures, workshops, reflective exercises and theoretical sessions exploring the teaching and learning dimensions of visual art in primary and post-primary curricula in Ireland. Students are encouraged to examine their own learning styles in the context of current insights into the processes of teaching and learning.

Second Level School Observation and Primary School Curriculum

1. Students undertake observation in a second level school shadowing an art teacher. These observation days are used as a mode of action research for a shared learning day, where students will present their reflections and findings in teams, to the entire group for discussion.

2. Students engage in a series of lectures and workshops exploring the Primary School Visual Arts Curriculum and related pedagogies, they are facilitated to design and deliver a collaborative scheme of work in an Access primary school. This placement offers an opportunity for 1st year students to experience and understand art/design in a primary school context, design and implement appropriate art workshops in conjunction with the host teacher drawing on the Art and Design strands of the Primary School Curriculum. Students are asked to keep visual records of the work process and evaluate their learning throughout their placement.

The module aims to:

- 1. introduce students to professional practices and processes in visual arts education in primary and post-primary education.
- 2. explore the concept of the pedagogical turn in art and design practice.
- 3. facilitate students to undertake a collaborative scheme of work in a primary school and implement ideas and methodologies for practical learning situations.
- 4. develop an awareness of fundamental professional practices through observation and reflection in a secondary school and on primary placement.

What will I learn?

On successful completion of this module students will be able to:

- Identify distinctive processes of teaching and learning in, of and through art and design.
- Critically analyse and evaluate their own personal learning experiences.
- Engage constructively with learners and professional educators in authentic education settings.
- Present their collaborative learning experience to their peers and reflect on the teaching and learning in relation to the curriculum.

How will I have the chance to evaluate the module?
