Synopsis

This module focuses on those key theoretical paradigms from the 20th Century that are foundational for Contemporary Art Discourse. Students will engage in some of the major intellectual movements that emerged in the contexts of modernity and postmodernity. Indicative content includes key terms such as Formalism, Structuralism, The Social History of Art, Psychoanalysis and Phenomenology amongst others and the writings of Rosalind Krauss, Jacques Lacan, TJ Clark, Roland Barthes and Maurice Merleau-Ponty.

What will I learn?

On successful completion of this module students should be able to:

- 1. RESEARCH those key theoretical paradigms from the 20th Century that inform current debates in contemporary art
- 2. ANALYZE: the discursive foundations and coordinates for their own intellectual position; in particular those from the 20th Century;
- 3. COMMUNICATE: a good knowledge of important theoretical paradigms and key figures from the 20th Century and relate these to their own work.
