Exchange applicants should demonstrate an intermediate level of English language ability equivalent to B1 on the Common European Framework of References for Languages (CEF). B2 is expected for the students applying to the BA in Visual Culture, Bureau+ or any Postgraduate programme. NCAD does not offer English language classes, however, exchange students can attend an informal series of Visual Culture seminars. Throughout this course there is a focus on speaking and writing about visual culture fluently and with confidence in English, and support will be provided for essay writing and associated tasks.
